From our Synodically Authorized Ministers (SAMS)...

Over the last four years, I have been conducting a Community Bible Study in Owen and Greenwood. We started off with the first class on How We Got the Old Testament. The next class was, obviously, How We Got the New Testament. In those classes, we discussed who wrote the documents of the Bible, if we can truly know, and when were those documents written. It's like a great detective story, trying to discover who did what and when.

We followed that up with classes on What Became of the Disciples, the Letters of Paul, the Authorship of the Letter to the Hebrews (the answer to this may surprise you!), and more. We are now in the sixth week of a class called Nothing to Be Afraid of: a Study of the Book of Revelation.

This class seeks to shear away the ongoing fright regarding the Book of Revelation. Revelation is an example of what we call apocalyptic literature. Revelation represents the apocalyptic literature of the New Testament and the best example of Old Testament apocalyptic literature Is the Book of Daniel. There are portions of Isaiah and Ezekiel that are also apocalyptic in nature. Here's the thing, we should never be frightened by those books. All the talk of angels and dragons and beasts and more were never intended to make us afraid. In fact, they are books of great comfort for us. The main point of those books is that we are not in this alone. There are forces in this world and above this world that are participating with us. It is a source of great hope.

As we begin to work more closely together, my hope is to begin Bible studies for the Northwoods STaR Ministries Parish. I'm very excited to get started.

We have moved into the congregational annual meeting season. I have already attended Ogema's and thanks to Tracy's scheduling skill I will attend another in February and Travis will attend the other two.

It helps me to get to know more people and gain a better understanding of the ministry of each congregation, both of which I enjoy doing.

Notation time: As I told those at Ogema's meeting, I normally remember details related to a person, but names often take more time to learn.

"God's Country: faith, hope, and the future of the Rural Church" by Brad Roth, is a book that I have found more interesting, useful and easier to read than I expected. I would like to paraphrase a few things he emphasized.

One is that small rural churches should not compare themselves to urban churches to decide if they are successful. They are two different "critters" that often serve God in different ways.

Roth and pastors of churches considered to be successful rural churches strongly suggest finding out what the community needs and then determining what their church could do to help. Listening, observing and praying are all very important before selecting a ministry activity. An appropriate example would be asking local school systems what student, parent and staff needs they can identify. Then discuss and decide how your congregation or parish could do something to help.

A final thought. Rural churches and communities can often accomplish some ministry events that would be difficult if not impossible to do in a large urban area.


