# From Travis...

What is going on in Palestine and Israel is about 70 years old. People want to say that it is centuries, or even thousands of years, old but they are wrong. Also, it is not a religious struggle. People want to make it that way but it is something even more fundamental than that. The question is over economics and land ownership.

Sure, the adversaries are of different religions (the Israelis are largely Jewish and the Palestinians are Muslim), but it's still more than that. After the Romans had pushed the Jews into exile after the Bar Kochba Rebellion during the second century A.D., the Jews were scattered across the Roman Empire. Some were sent to Spain and France and North Africa, while others went to what is today considered eastern Europe, even Russia.

The Jews had a very difficult time finding a home. Even after the fall of the Roman Empire, the Jews could not carve out for themselves a new homeland. The Muslims/Arabs had taken over Palestine and it was now their home. For many of them, Palestine had always been their homeland.

As the Empire gave way to the Middle Ages and then to Modern Europe, the Europeans continually wanted to push out the Jews from Europe and there were many pogroms against them in Russia and Bohemia (modern day Czech Republic and Slovakia), as well as Germany, Spain, and even Italy.

In 1914, before the start of World War I, Lord Balfour of Britain made what came to be known as the Balfour Declaration. The declaration declared the need for a Jewish homeland. The target was a homeland carved out of Palestine. During the war, the British had taken Palestine from the Ottoman Empire (the Turks) and now they were ready to use that land to create the Jewish homeland. It wasn't because Balfour loved the Jewish people. In fact, it was quite the opposite. Balfour and other European nobility wanted to chase the Jewish people out of Europe and this was the perfect way to do it. The truth is, Balfour had no right to make such a Declaration, but it gained much support.

With the end of World War I, the British were suddenly not so interested in providing a homeland for the Jews. They didn't want to get rid of this newly-acquired territory in the near east. So, the whole idea of a Jewish homeland was put on hold until the catastrophe of World War II. It wasn't just Nazi Germany that tormented the Jewish people, the Soviet Union was also responsible, as was Italy, and so many other places. Even the United States turned away ship loads of Jewish refugees, sending them back to Germany. The same went for England and France, Spain, and Sweden. The end of World War II and the Holocaust saw the need for a Jewish homeland.

From 1946 to 1948, the United Nations and the European powers began the creation of the state of Israel. The only problem was, of course, that there were already people living there... The Palestinians, who had been there for almost 2000 years. But the Jews, now called Israelis, demanded that this was their ancestral home and the European powers agreed with them. From the beginning, the Palestinians declared that the land was not Britain's to give.

So, imagine this. You own your home in Wisconsin or wherever and you have lived there for all your life and maybe even your parents' and grandparents' lives. Then, one day, a family of Native Americans knock on your door and says, "Our family lived here 600 years ago. We were sent away to live somewhere else but now we've come back and your house belongs to us." That is what happened between the Israelis and the Palestinians. It wasn't even that the Palestinians were told to move to another house, they were told to get out of the country.

They were given other places to live, and then they were pushed from those places. Some of the Palestinians tried to go into Jordan, some to Saudi Arabia, some to Syria, some to Egypt, and no one accepted them. In that way, the Jews and the Palestinians are so much alike. They have been chased out of everywhere and no one wants them.

Then the Israelis stepped up the program of gobbling up more and more Palestinian lands. You should look at maps that compare Palestine in 1946, 1961, 1969, 1972, 1990, and today. You will see just how drastic the landgrab has been, with the Palestinians losing almost all of the land allotted to them, while Israel has grown 300% or more.

In 1967, the Israelis launched a preemptive attack against Egypt, Jordan, and Syria. In the process, they attacked a US surveillance ship, called the USS Liberty. Google the attack on the USS Liberty and see what you find. The Israelis wanted to disable the US intelligence-gathering capability in order to hide this preemptive assault on three sovereign nations. It was called the Six Day War. They gobbled up more land in 2 the process.

Then came the Yom Kippur war in 1973, when Egypt tried to retake the Sinai Peninsula from Israel and Syria wanted to retake the Golan Heights from Israel. It was mostly unsuccessful and Israel began at decades-long process of creating new housing settlements in these conquered territories. All the while, the Palestinians were continually driven from place to place looking for somewhere to call home.

The Palestinians did indeed fight a guerilla style war against the Israelis but, in the 1980s, other nations began to get involved in proxy wars against Israel. After the Camp David accords of 1979, Egypt was now out of conflict. But 1979 also saw the Islamic Revolution in Iran. When the Ayatollah Khomeini took over from the Shah in February 1979, he began Iran's own proxy war against the Israelis. Hamas and Hezbollah both became puppets of Iran in that struggle.

The current struggle is an Iran-funded all-out assault by Hamas against Israel. But when Israel responds, it is not against Hamas. It is against the Palestinian people in Gaza and other Palestinian districts. It is a tragedy of unimaginable proportions. President Jimmy Carter has called the situation in the Occupied Territories "an apartheid regime."

Truth be told, my heart goes out to the Israeli families who have suffered but, in equal measure, to the Palestinians who have suffered.

Israel has won the right to exist but the Palestinians are fighting an existential struggle for survival and autonomy. The two-state solution, Palestine and Israel, is the only real solution for peace but nobody seems to support the idea anymore.

People fail to see that the Palestinians and the Israelis are simply flipsides of the same coin. Nobody wants either one of them.

The British surrendered Palestine because it technically had taken Palestine from the Ottoman Empire. It really wasn't theirs in the first place but, since they had seized it during World War I, they offered it for the new Israeli homeland.

It was originally a protectorate under the British empire, and the British weren't willing to let it all go. So, 1947, David Ben-Gurion began a successful war of liberation from the British. He later became the first Israeli Prime Minister. Albert Einstein had been offered the presidency.

However, Einstein did not support the establishment of a Jewish state, instead asserting that he would "much rather see a reasonable agreement reached with the Arabs on the basis of living together in peace" under the framework of a binational Jewish–Arab state. No one listened.


