# From Travis...

During our Advent service of December, we followed Dietrich Bonhoeffer's *God is in the Manger*. This was a primary-source study of Bonhoeffer's Advent and Christmastime devotions. After deep discussion, Tracy and I had decided to focus on Dietrich's incarnational Bible studies and devotions in order to better acquaint the Northwoods STaR Ministries Parish with such an important theologian and thinker.

With that in mind, our Lenten service will also follow Dietrich's God is on the Cross. Furthermore, I decided to use this article in our February newsletter to give you a better look at Dietrich and his importance for us.

Last month's article was concerning Jesus and Politics. Politics is always an integral part in the life of the church and our responsibility to the world. Dietrich and the Bonhoeffer clan would immediately recognize that responsibility and act on it.

January 29, 1933, was a dreadful day in the history of Europe and indeed the whole human race. On that day, the German President Paul von Hindenberg appointed a new Chancellor of Germany, Adolf Hitler. The move was a political compromise made to appease the growing power of the National Socialist German Workers' Party, the Nazi Party.

In the 1928 elections, the Nazi Party gathered only 2.6% of the vote. After four years of campaigning and intimidation, the March 1932 elections saw Hitler running for president which he lost to Hindenberg. In the July elections, however, the Nazis won almost 38% of the vote and became the controlling party in the German Parliament. Hindenberg had to make a deal with the Nazis to form a majority government.

As a result of that deal, January 29, 1933, saw Hitler appointed as the number two man in the German government and he wasted no time in consolidating his power. His moves were swift and merciless.

On February 27 of the same year, the Reichstag or German Parliament was mysteriously burned to the ground. The Communists were blamed for it and the very next day, Hitler forced President Hindenberg to issue the *The Reichstag Fire Edict* which effectively abolished the civil rights of the German constitution under the guise of protecting the state against the Communists.

Less than a month later, on March 23, 1933, Hitler pushed through the *Enabling Act* which gave legislative and executive power to Hitler who could now pass laws without the approval of the Parliament. Hitler was now dictator after less than two full months.

For many people who have read the history of the times and for some who lived in the times, it was almost universally believed that the German people allowed it all to happen without a struggle; the attacks on the Jews and others, the concentration camps and the war were all accepted by the nation.

Nothing—nothing—could be farther from the truth.

In the family home in Berlin on the evening of January 29, 1933, the Bonhoeffer family listened to the radio after the evening meal and heard the pronouncement that Adolf Hitler had been appointed Chancellor of the German Republic. Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer was sitting near his brother-in-law Rüdiger Scheicher who said aloud, "That means war."

The Bonhoeffers had not been idle in following the progress of this radical movement that preached of "true Germans" and of unswerving patriotism. The sloganeering was captivating and shouted down those who disagreed by saying "all the right words."

On February 2, 1933, Dietrich Bonhoeffer delivered a radio address to the German people on the concept of the leader (German: "führer"). In the speech he said, "The leader must be responsibly aware of the clear limit to his authority. If he understands his function differently, then the image of the leader slips into that of the misleader"

Before the *Reichstag Fire Edict*, before the *Enabling Act*, Bonhoeffer saw the danger lying ahead in a nation ruled by such ideologues. Before he could even finish his radio broadcast, the power was cut, silencing his speech.

The Bonhoeffer family became one of the focal points in the resistance to Hitler from the very beginning. Brothers-in-law Hans von Dohnanyi and Rüdiger Schleicher would work for the *Abwehr* (Military Intelligence) to formulate the conspiracy to assassinate Hitler.

Dietrich himself would be employed by the *Abwehr* to carry messages to the Allies through Church channels. He even organized and executed "Operation 7" which rescued a group of Jews, helping them to flee Germany.


Despite the monstrosity of the Nazis, the Bonhoeffers and others like them would not cave in to the rabid nationalism of Hitler's thugs. Though it cost the lives of Hans, Rüdiger, Dietrich and so many more, one family saw the menace from the start and never surrendered to the evil of inaction.


